## **Submission Instructions**

- 1. Ensure the tick is dead by drowning the tick in alcohol.
- 2. Place the dead tick in a water-tight container (e.g. ziplock bag) with either an alcohol pad or paper towel / cotton ball doused with alcohol to prevent desiccation.
- 3. Make sure that the container/zip-log bag is sealed to prevent leakage.
- 4. If a lot of ticks are removed from a single animal host, please consider shipping specimens to us in multiple envelopes/containers to prevent specimen damage and leakage.
- 5. Fill out specimen submission form (above) for each submission and attach with specimen(s)
- 6. Cut and keep these instructions.
- 7. Package specimen(s) and the submission form(s) well to avoid damage during shipment.
- 8. Use postage paid envelopes provided for specimens that are shipped in zip-lock bags. For specimens shipped in larger containers, please mail them to:
