

Outbreak Report for June 2026 West Virginia

During the month of June 2026, there were nineteen outbreaks reported in West Virginia, and eighteen were confirmed as outbreaks or clusters of disease. Reported outbreaks occurred in eight long-term care facilities (LTCF), four daycares, and six within community-based settings occurring in single counties, multiple regions, or multiple states including West Virginia.

The rest of this report describes the types and settings of the outbreaks. All data provided is provisional as some outbreaks may still be under investigation.

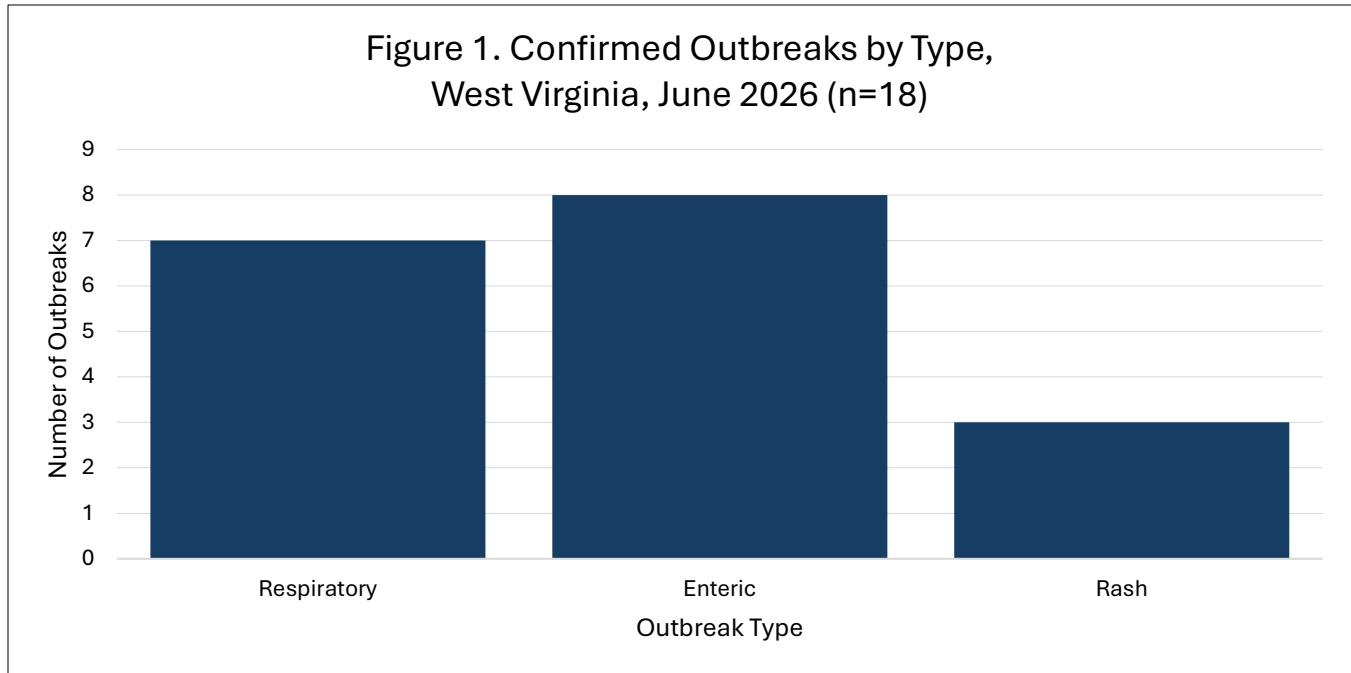
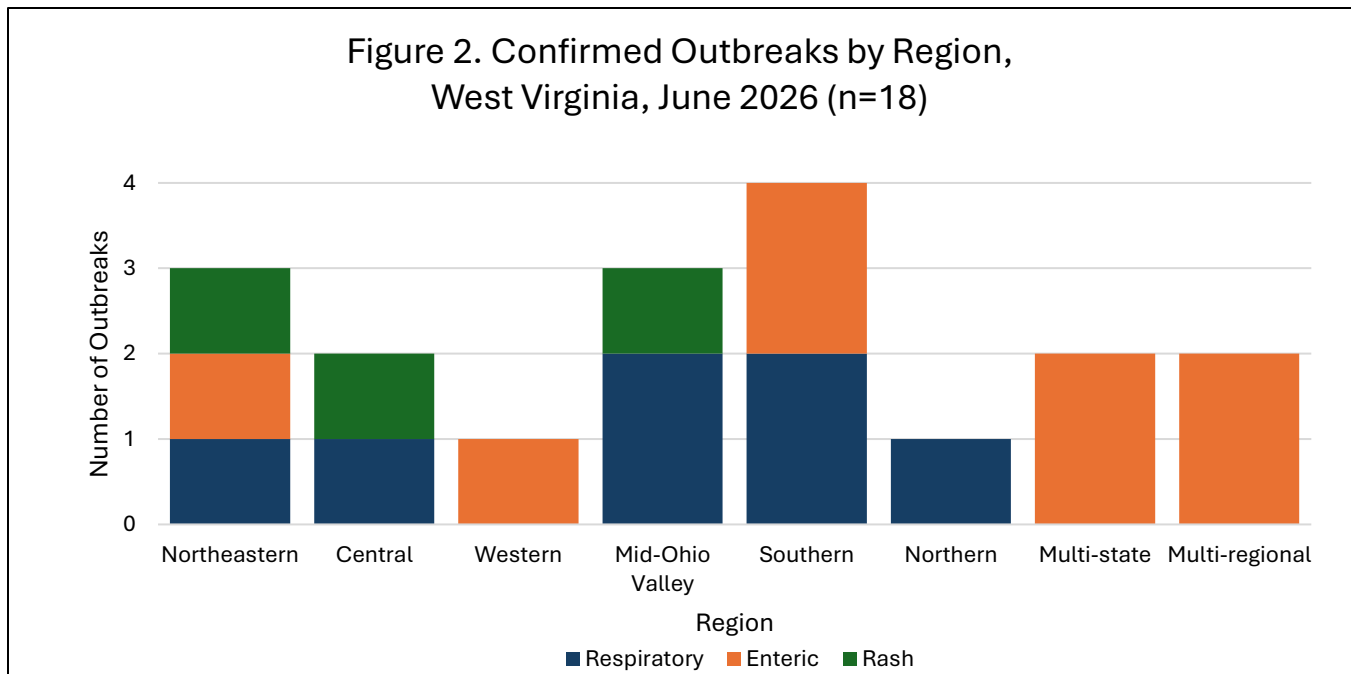
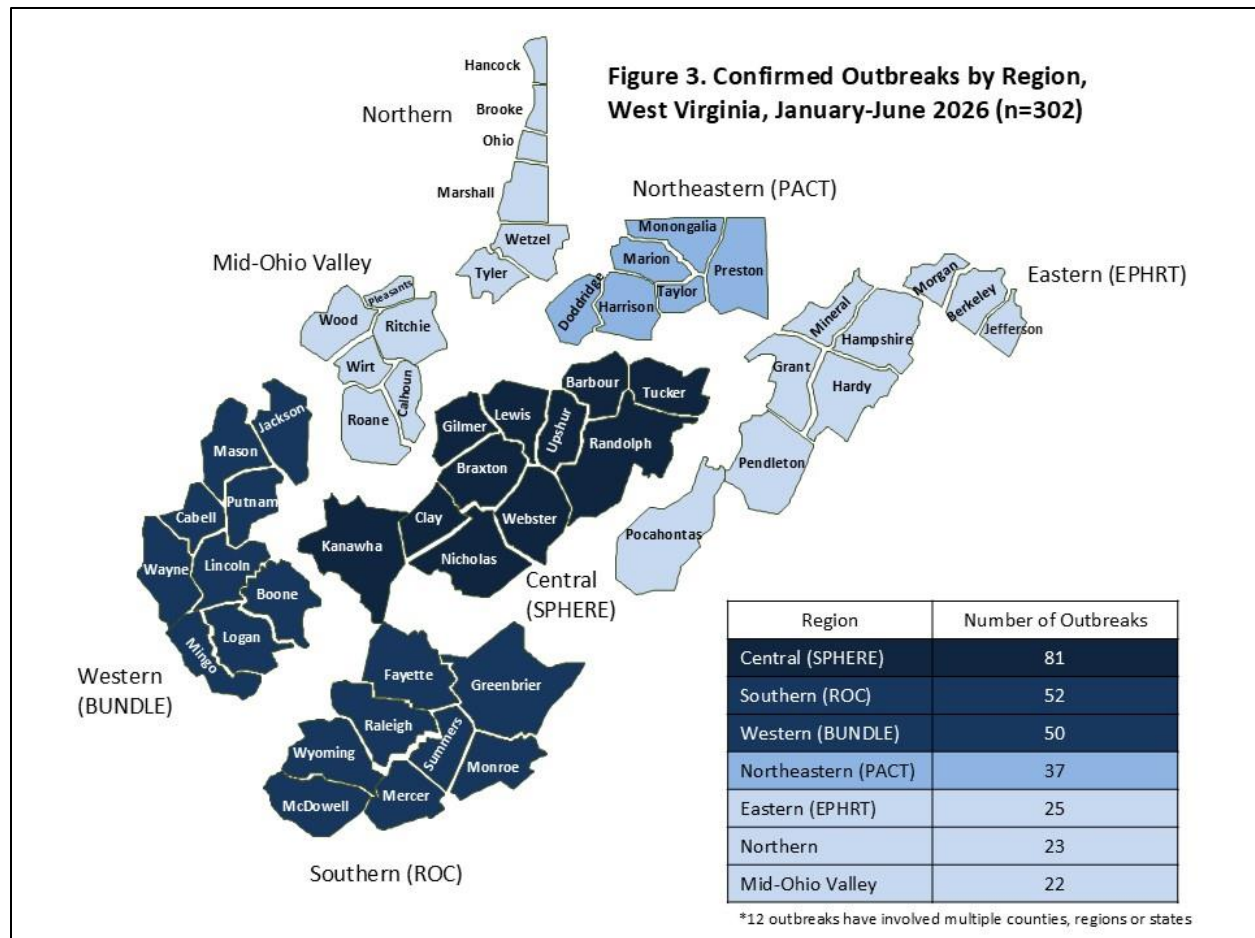


Figure 2 illustrates the number of outbreaks per region by type.



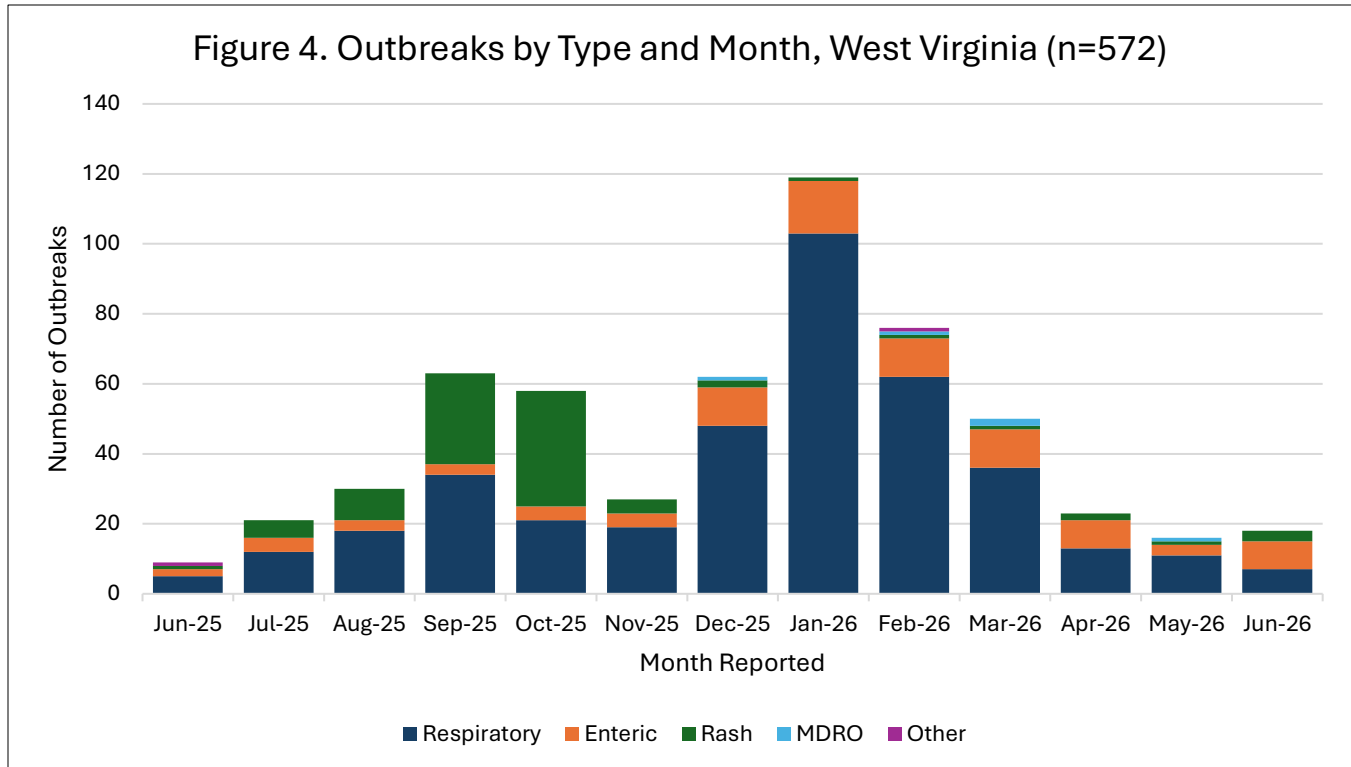
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Figure 3 displays the number of outbreaks by region.
