Outbreak Report for June 2025 West Virginia

During the month of June 2025, there were 10 outbreaks reported in West Virginia, and 9 were confirmed to be outbreaks or clusters of disease. Six occurred in long-term care facilities, two were community-based, and one was in daycare.

The rest of this report describes the types and settings of the outbreaks. All data provided is provisional as some outbreaks may still be under investigation.






Figure 2 illustrates the number of outbreaks per region by type.







Figure 3 displays the number of outbreaks by region.








Figure 4 displays the number of outbreaks by type and month for the period from 2024 to 2025.
