

During the month of November 2025, there were twenty-eight outbreaks reported in West Virginia and twenty-seven were confirmed to be outbreaks or clusters of disease. Reported settings included 12 long-term care facilities (LTCF), 6 schools, 4 daycares, 2 in psychiatric hospitals, 2 in other healthcare settings, and 1 community based.

The rest of this report describes the types and settings of the outbreaks. All data provided is provisional as some outbreaks may still be under investigation.

Figure 1 illustrates confirmed outbreaks by type.




Figure 2 illustrates the number of outbreaks per region by type.






Figure 3 displays the number of outbreaks by region.







Figure 4 displays the number of outbreaks by type and month for the period from 2024 to 2025.
