

During the month of July 2025, there were 22 outbreaks reported in West Virginia, and 21 were confirmed to be outbreaks or clusters of disease. Twelve occurred in long-term care facilities (LTCF), five in daycares, and one each in a community setting, across multiple regions, across multiple states, and in a hospital.

The rest of this report describes the types and settings of the outbreaks. All data provided is provisional as some outbreaks may still be under investigation.

Figure 1 illustrates confirmed outbreaks by type.




Figure 2 illustrates the number of outbreaks per region by type.






Figure 3 displays the number of outbreaks by region.







Figure 4 displays the number of outbreaks by type and month for the period from 2024 to 2025.
