- 1. Place tick in a zip-lock bag with an alcohol pad.
- 2. Place zip-lock bag in another zip-lock bag to prevent leakage.
- 3. Fill out specimen submission form (above) for each specimen and attach to ziplock bag with specimen. <u>CUT</u> and <u>KEEP</u> these instructions.
- 4. Mail specimen(s) and the submission form(s) to WVVTSP in the postage-paid envelope provided. If you do not have an envelope, mail to:
