BioSense 2.0: West Virginia Syndromic Surveillance System Confidentiality and Use Agreement

- 1) Only use BioSense 2.0 data in the course of fulfilling job duties and not share data with unauthorized users
- 2) Safeguard the user ID and/or password against unauthorized use
- 3) Read and accept the Information Access and Confidentiality Standards of BioSense 2.0

It is the responsibility of the Supervisor of the applicant to promptly inform the State Administrator when the applicant's access needs to be cancelled upon job change/ termination/ retirement.
